



## ECONOMICS: BRIDGING ACTIVITY

### What is Economics About?

This activity is designed to help you to understand at least something about what you will be studying and to be able to identify some of the key economic issues and problems that make up the subject.

The economy therefore is faced with three key questions that have to be answered - irrelevant of the complexity of the economic system involved.

Task 1: Create a 2 sided A4 Economics newsletter that includes:

- The recent (last 3 years) performance of the UK economy.
  - Include information &/or a data table or chart on:
    - Economic Growth levels in the UK
    - Unemployment levels in the UK
    - Inflation rates in the UK
- Key UK government policy [education, business, tax, jobs etc]
- Announcements of investment by firms (new plant/factory etc) or closure of firms in differing industries
- A brief written analysis explaining whether the UK economy is showing a good or poor performance
- Financial banking news
- Business news of large major companies
- Find a picture and name the:
  - UK Prime Minister
  - UK Chancellor of the Exchequer
  - Governor of the Bank of England

## **Task 2**

Write a report explaining how BREXIT could influence UK businesses. You need to use business examples to illustrate your points and, where relevant, refer to macro-economic indicators such as interest rates, exchange rates and inflation.

### **Structure of your essay:**

- a) Introduction - briefly outline the European Union and the recent BREXIT.
- b) Explain the potential negative impacts of BREXIT for UK businesses (use examples of businesses).
- c) Explain the potential positive impacts of BREXIT for UK businesses (use examples of businesses).
- d) Conclusion - give your own personal view in regards to the impacts on UK Businesses.
